Kua mutu, kua tīmata

"Kua mutu, kua tīmata" - translated means "it is finished, now it is begun".

The school's motto since 1975 has more than one meaning - as a stone cast into a pond will generate many ripples.

As King Edward High School closed its doors, the students from that school, together with a new cohort, began a different learning journey at a brand new school called Logan Park High School.

For those founding students, as for our ākonga in the present day, these important years are a time for finishing and for beginning. For ending the time of childhood and moving confidently into the adult world.

And finally, our motto reminds us that our present is born from our past and from our place; that we stand on the shoulders of those who have come before, and carry their wairua with us.

Beneath the mountain of Kaupukataumahaka (Mt Cargill), the land on which Logan Park stands is Taunuunu Kapuaiteraki - the place where fountains of knowledge form.

The Waitaha people used to come to this place, where our school now stands, and be instructed in navigation, cooking and hunting - knowledge and skills important to students over 600 years ago.

Today, the nature of our mahi may have changed, but the kaupapa of learning and nurturing has not.

We come to the same kura beneath the same mountains and yet we are not the same. We are different. We celebrate our differences. How do we do this? Through interviews, hui, strong links with our contributing kura, our membership in the Community of Learning (Kāhui Āko) and a belief that we need to listen at least as much as we speak, we are determined to hear and value the stories our ākonga and their whānau bring with them as they join the Logan Park community.

This strong culture of communication is a web with many strands, with its centre being the Group system, where students of different ages meet with their Group teacher and or House Dean each day. Students stay with the same House and Group Teacher for the duration of their time at school. This ensures that a caring and trusting relationship can be developed and maintained between student, teacher and whānau.

Weekly feedback from subject teachers, parent teacher interview nights, full written reports and daily attendance texts home, online learning technologies and emails are further ways that we maintain transparent, 'no surprises' lines of communication with home.

Logan Park is a caring school. Our teachers teach students, not just subjects. A wide range of approachable staff are always available to listen and advise, from the classroom teacher to the pastoral care team to senior management and the support staff.

Logan Park provides students with the security of clear boundaries and explicit expectations for behaviour. Some students may require support with managing the workload of secondary school, while others may need help building selfesteem or managing their relationships with others.

In all cases, we support students to play a positive role in our school, and highly value the partnerships we forge with whānau to this end. Respect is not demanded; it is given, so that it will be returned. Our peer support and peer mentoring programmes ensure that it is not just staff modelling our values but also senior students. Bullying of any kind has no place at Logan Park.


